



# *POINTED ARROW QUILT*

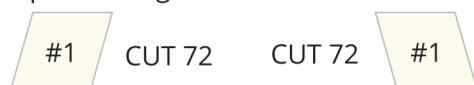
The Pointed Arrow quilt by Lunden Designs and featuring Wildland is a perfectly stunning and beginner friendly quilt design for modern sewists. You'll fall in love with your Pointed Arrow Quilt whether it's draped over your favorite chair, or keeping you warm at night. Or take it out for a picnic and wow your friends and family!



## cutting instructions

**Step 1.** Cut out parallelogram pattern pieces from last page.

**Step 2.** With all 16 Wildland prints stacked, cut out your parallelograms from Pattern #1.



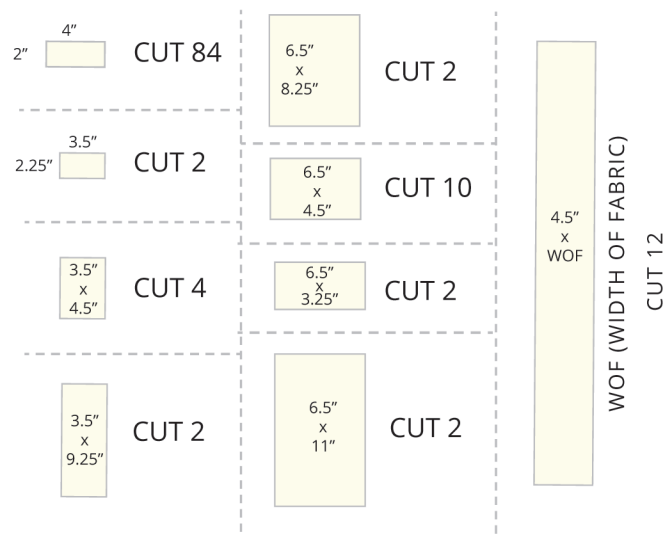
### FROM THE CREAM SASHING

**Step 3.** Cut the following:

a. cut 60 parallelogram pieces from Pattern #2



b. cut the following pieces for sashing,



## time to sew!

1. From your Wildland parallelogram pieces, sew each side of the block together and press seams open. Trim and square off excess of your 2x4" sashing pieces. **Refer to Figure 1.**

2. Line up the seams and sew each side together. **Refer to Figure 2.**

## pointed arrow quilt

**seam allowance:** 1/4"

**block size:** 6" X 20"

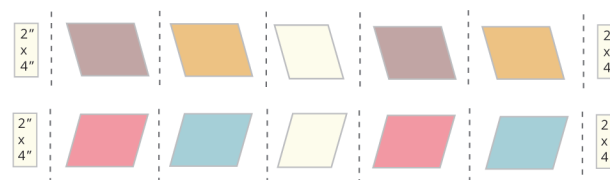
### fabric requirements:

- Fat Quarters of entire Wildland Collection (we omitted Arrowhead Cream, 16 total)
- 3 Yards Birch Solid Cream Poplin for sashing
- 5 Yards for backing (your choice)
- 3/4 Yards for Binding (we chose Archery Rain)

3. Make a total of 15 full blocks.

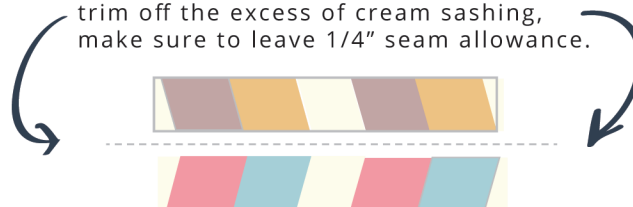
4. Make a total of 6 half blocks for left and right columns. **Refer to Assembly Diagram on next page.**

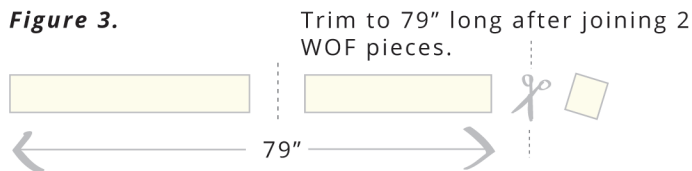
After sewing together, square up and trim off the excess of cream sashing, make sure to leave 1/4" seam allowance.





5. Now that your blocks are finished. Sew together the sashing column pieces by sewing together two WOF (width of fabric pieces) by their short ends. Trim to 79" long. **Refer to Figure 3.**

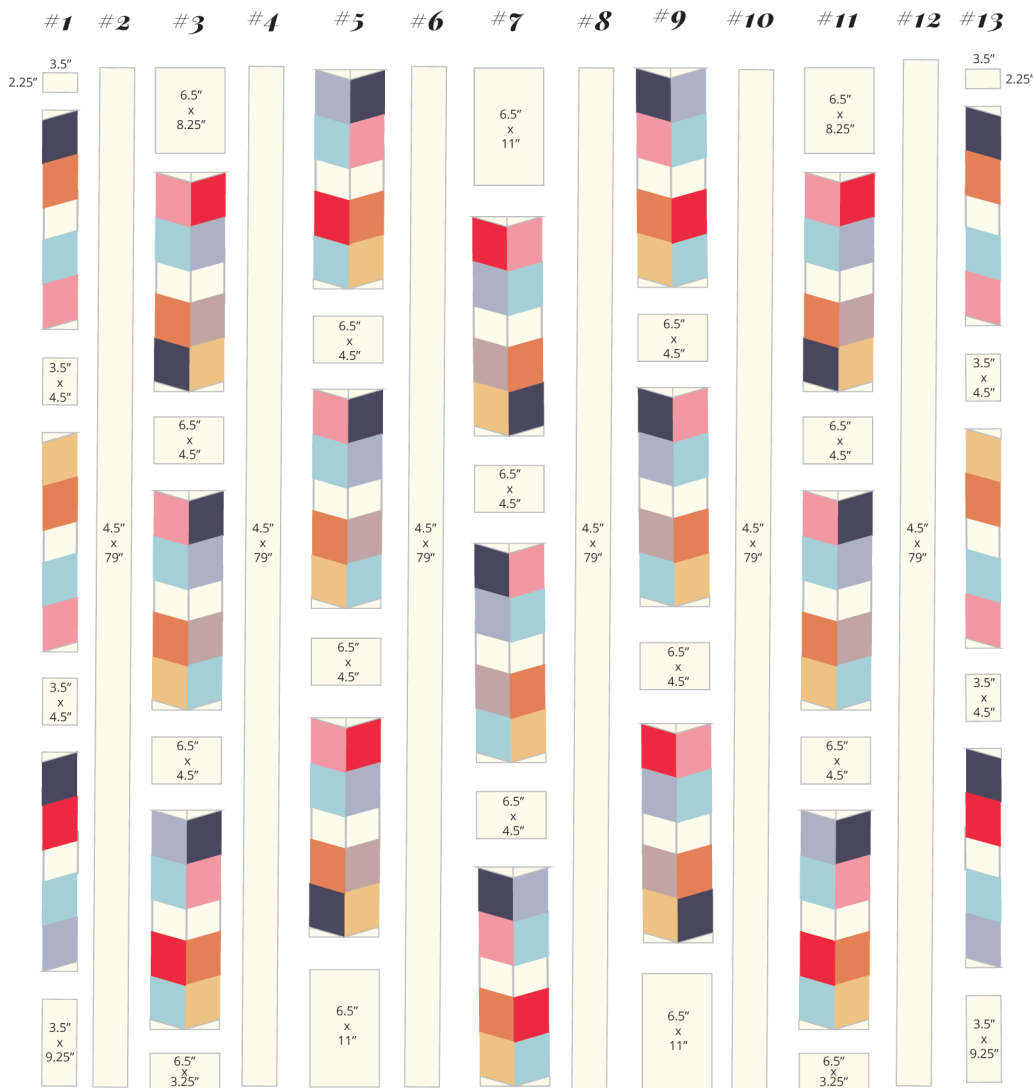
6. Join each column of blocks and sashing. **See numbered columns in Assembly Diagram below.**

7. Pin each finished column together before joining so that each end matches up. Otherwise, you can get distorted columns because the fabrics can pull a little.

8. Finally, join all of your finished blocks and sashing pieces according to the assembly diagram below! Good job! Your quilt top is done!

9. Sandwich, Quilt, Bind. Enjoy!
