We love the assortment of blues and the bright pop of yellow. We suggest fussy cutting your Charley Harper fabrics to really make them shine. Who could resist this perfectly Maritime quilt with it's cute dolphins, seagulls, and school of fish?





SEAM ALLOWANCE: 1/4"

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

1/2 yards of 3 Charley Harper Maritime prints:

1. Dolphun
2. Seagull and Crab
3. School of Fish Royal

1/4 Yard of Solid Marigold

1 3/4 Yards for sashing (we used Birch Solid Cream)

1/2 Yard for binding (we used Birch Solid Marigold)

2 Yards for backing (we used Seagull and Crab)

GENERAL TIP:

Press all seams open.

CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS

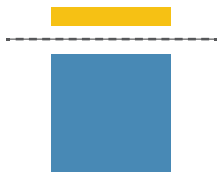
1. From each print:
 - a. cut three 5" x 5" squares.
 - b. cut three 15" x 5" rectangles
2. From the marigold solid:
 - a. cut eight 1" x 5" rectangles
 - b. cut fourteen 1" x 5.5" rectangles
 - c. cut ten 15" x 1" rectangles
3. From the cream solid for sashing:
 - a. cut eight 41" x 4" strips
 - b. cut seventeen 4" x 5.5" rectangles
 - c. cut eight 5" x 5.5" rectangles

TIME TO SEW!

SMALL BLOCKS

1. Sew a 1" x 5" piece of yellow sashing to the top of the square prints. See Figure 1 below.

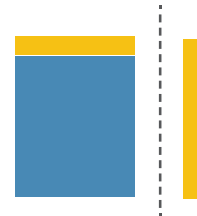

SMALL BLOCKS

2. Sew the 1" x 5.5" yellow rectangle to the side of the block, as shown in Figure 2 below. Please refer to the assembly diagram to view which side of the block to sew on.

LARGE BLOCKS

3. Sew the 15" x 1" marigold pieces to the bottom of the large rectangle prints. See figure 3 below.

4. Following the assembly diagram, sew the 1" x 5.5" marigold strips vertically to the sides of the large rectangle pieces.

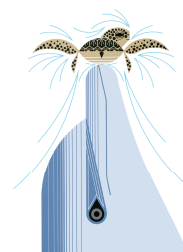
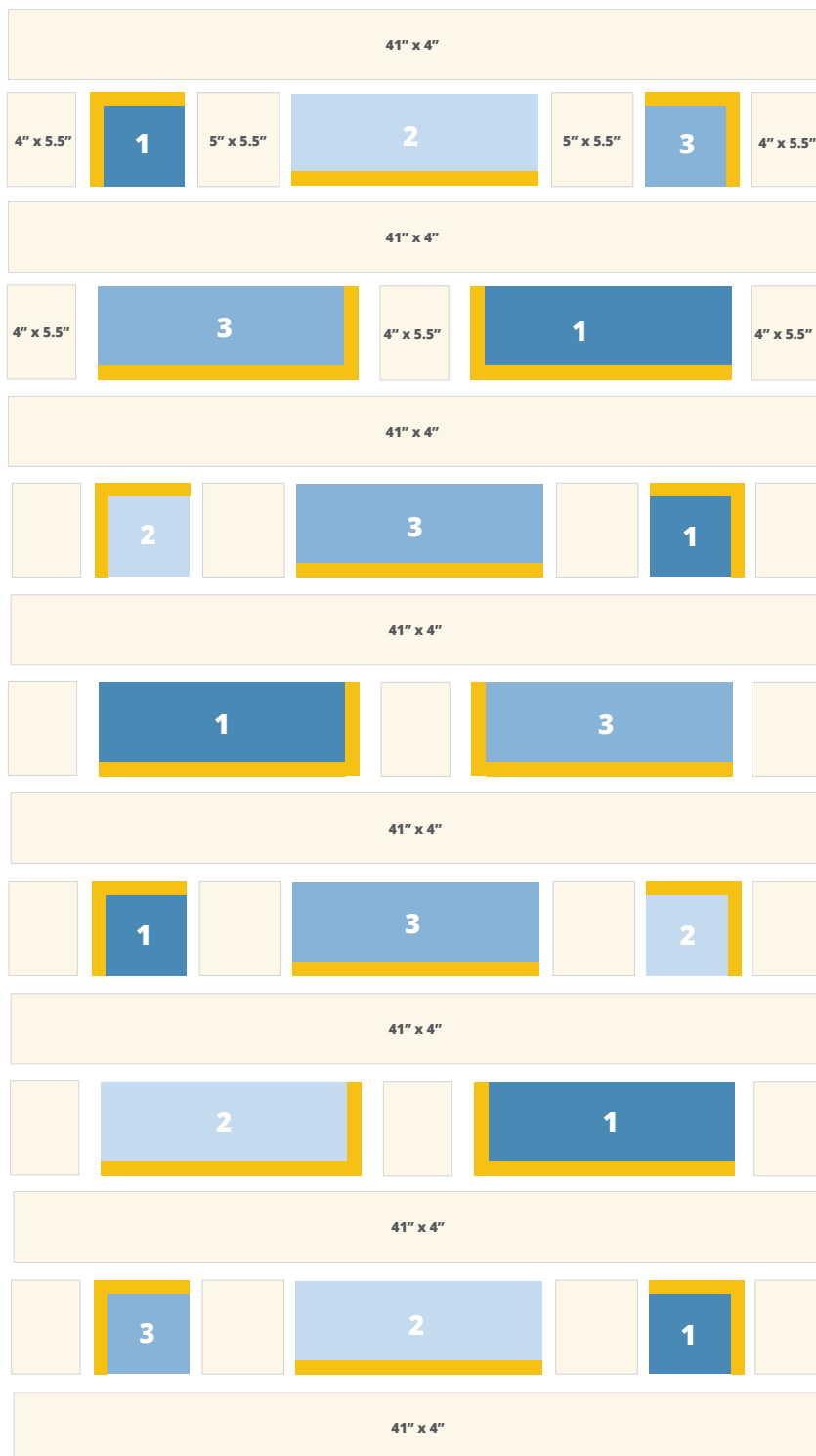
4. Lay out your blocks and sashing pieces. Sew the pieces of each row together as shown in the assembly diagram on the next page.

5. Quilt, bind, use, and love.





ASSEMBLY DIAGRAM



DON'T FORGET

First sew you blocks, then sew your rows, and then join your rows to one another.

HELPFUL TIP

Refer to the numbered prints in the assembly diagram for a helpful guide to arranging the layout of your quilt.
